The Development Committee is a sub-committee of the Board, and exists to harness the connections, expertise, ideas and dedication of Mountview's network. Together, its members make a vital contribution to the success and long-term sustainability of Mountview by identifying and brokering new funding relationships, acting as advocates for the institution and supporting the Executive and Development Teams to increase philanthropy and sponsorship year on year.

The Committee meets four times a year at a location in central London. Appointments will initially be for a three year term, with the possibility of reappointment for a maximum of two further three year terms by mutual agreement.

Membership of the Development Committee is a senior volunteering position and is therefore not remunerated, however reasonable expenses for travel incurred in carrying out duties may be claimed.
